



About the College

Scottish Church College was established in 1830. The college founder, Rev. Alexander Duff, was the first missionary to India from the Church of Scotland. His idea was to set up an institution which linked western education with Christian mission and the eventual progress of the people - years later the College is committed to the vision of its founding father and aims at academic excellence along with social awareness and character building. The aim of the College as that of its founder is primarily to impart liberal education pervaded by the universal principles and spiritual and moral values based on the life and teachings of Jesus Christ; also to produce intellectually sound, morally upright, socially concerned and spiritually oriented men and women to be of service to the nation.

Service-learning

Kothari Commission (1964) recommended that the purpose of education should be associated with some form of social service. Service-learning aims at creating a link between academic studies and social service. The philosophy of service-learning is based on experiential learning where students can implement their learning for community service. In this volatile, uncertain, complex and ambiguous (VUCA) world, where crisis in our socio-cultural values is evident, the philosophy of service learning emerges as a creative and constructive response to our foundation and for our future generations. Service-learning enhances our involvement in socio-civic issues through building the bridge between knowledge, service and active participation.

The teachers of Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) should encourage the students to provide service to society. Education not only contributes in developing individual faculties but also has a collective-welfare aspect for society. Therefore, teachers must understand the meaning of service-learning and encourage the students to share their knowledge in the communities and groups through service. The HEIs must facilitate proper resources to initiate this network between faculty members, students and communities in need of service. Moreover, research is integral to service-learning; social service is not possible without knowing the root cause of our social and civic problems. The relationship between academic studies, research and social service has an integral relationship.

The primary objective of the programme is to enable faculty members to comprehend the meaning and philosophy of service-learning process; the ethos of service-learning should prepare them to handle challenges arising out of these complex and uncertain situations and give a new direction to the students in this COVID new-normal order. The programme shall enable us to realise the need to become more responsible for our communities and the larger society. Faculty members can also take up research projects related to this aspect.

Objectives of the Programme

- a) To aware faculty members about the 'active-participant' aspect of every discipline in organised service with a motive to inculcate the idea that every subject can contribute in social service;
- b) To discuss the meaning and dimensions of experiential learning;
- c) To prepare our faculty members and institutions for the collaborative partnership between college and community;
- d) To familiarise the faculty members about the relationship between academic studies and civic management;
- e) To introduce the meaning and nature of Whole Person Education that explains the interconnectedness between universal, moral and spiritual values and connect with the pedagogy of service-learning.

Intended Outcome of the Programme

The participants should be able to:

- a) Understand the connection between academic studies and community service;
- b) Extend learning beyond the conventional classroom teachings;
- c) Make knowledge immediate and relevant in the current context;
- d) Get a broader framework as to why the faculty members from different academic disciplines should understand the meaning of service-learning and the necessity to communicate to students in this VUCA world;
- e) Recognise the reciprocal and interactive relationships amongst teachers, students and communities through our problem-solving and critical skills.




Feedback Analysis of the workshop:

The concept of Service Learning (SL) presented by the Resource Person can be best described as 52 responses




Duration of the sessions were




Your level of understanding of the concept of SL can be described as $_{\rm 52\;responses}$






How far was the workshop able to meet up to your expectations 52 responses




