Agenda	Minutes
NAAC	Principal appreciated and acknowledged the efforts of the committee members for the successful NAAC re-accreditation. Dr. Mandal also highlighted how the IQAC coordinate along with Dr. Varbi Roy has been providing consultancy at different institutes in recent times.
Agenda in Adaptation	IQAC coordinator reported –
	NAAC Peer Team Visit.
	The Grade Sheet is presented in details for further discussions.
Recommendations of NAAC Peer Team	IQAC coordinator highlights two areas where the Peer team showed concern: 1. Research 2. Few number of PG departments.
	Principal also points at low NIRF ranking referring to poor research and only two Podepartments.
	Vice Principal points out that since we have PG departments, even though only two, we at being assessed as a PG institution with emphasis on research. This puts us at disadvantage. Perhaps increase in PG departments may increase scope in research as well.
	Dr. Varbi Roy argued that in Criteria 3 where we received lowest marks, the weightage of research is only 25 out of 110. We also need to concentrate on innovations on the part of the institution to build a research infrastructure. More publications and more PGs is not the answer as in publication for instance, it is impossible for humanities to contribute at part with science as arts and humanities in not represented in Scopus or WOS as ner CAR requirements. Thus we should look more into areas of innovation and extension to improve in this criterion and not merely in research on the part of the faculty, though the encouragement should always be there.
	Dr. Jayanta Sen Gupta recommended: 1. Internal allocation of marks in NAAC SSR need

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to be identified for better result.

- 2. While encouraging research, we should also concentrate on innovation and collaboration
- 3. We can think of building inter-disciplinary schools. He gave example of Jadavpur University where proposals were invited in this respect. After selection they were given a seed money and encouraged them to seek outside funding for sustenance.

Dr. Varbi Roy pointed out that we have already developed the Women's Cell in this regard and are in the process of planning a Peace Studies Cell as well. She also highlighted the UBCHEA funded Service Learning programme scheduled in August in this regard.

Dr. Sen Gupta encouraged collaborations on service learning with for example American Catholic Universities that have programmes like Study Abroad for students. He points out that how TISS may also be a resourceful collaboration in this respect that will help develop social entrepreneurship among students. This will be in line with the Christian values and the mission and vision of the institute as well. This will also help in placement of students in this field. Through such ventures extension activities in gender or environment can also be improved.

Dr. Esita Sur heading the SCC Women's Cell informs about the possible Swedish collaboration. She outlines her plans for the Cell that includes a Gender Champions Programme among the students and a newsletter.

Dr. Manna also recommends gender sensitisation among students through possible surveys.

Dr. Roy stated that the NAAC peer team Chairman suggested two publications per year to be ideal.

Dr. Rajyasri Ghosh pointed out funding difficulties in social sciences and points out SCCFRG as being a good opportunity here and recommends renewal of funds. She also insisted on PhD guide among arts faculty for students of other or private universities. Dr. Roy and Dr. Sur and Dr. Guha Thakurta pointed out this is not possible in arts. Dr. Das corroborates this by saying how reluctant CU is in this regard.

Principal informs about the now established Research Cell and the fact that the college is going to apply for DBT Star in the coming session.

Proposal to take feedback from all the stakeholders (Teachers, Students, NTS and Governing Body members) for further improvement.

AQAR Sub-committees

IQAC coordinator proposed the AQAR sub-committees and convenors for 2022. Accepted by members present.

Tridib Mohan was included in Criteria 5 on Dr. Guha Thakurta's request.

Report on MoUs & Collaborations

IQAC coordinator reported on the recent MoUs and collaboration of the College with other institutes.

On request of Dr. Das, Dr. Guha Thakurta briefly reported on the status of the collaboration with University of Warsaw and that a Students Conference proposal was now
