2016-2017

- 1. 



4. NSS Special Camp in the College and Adopted Slum--- The Special Camp for the session 2016-17 was organized in the college, college playground and adopted slum from 9th January to 15th January 2017. 








4. Observation Of International Cultural Diversity Day (Online) 21st May, 2021:







The Departmental celebration ended with plantation of saplings by two of our Students. 5 students participated.













