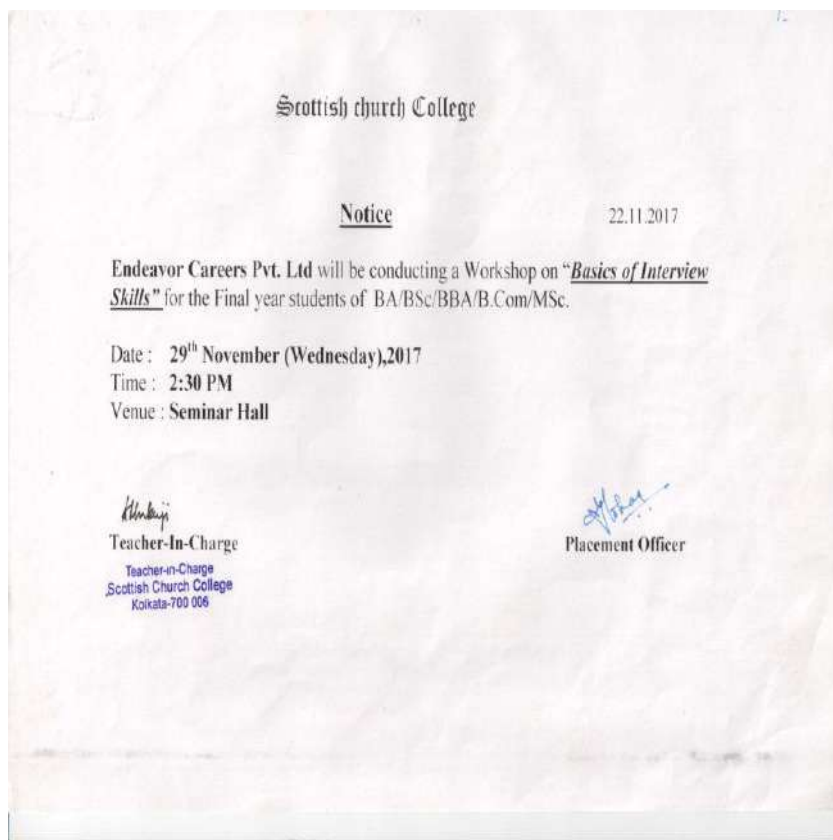

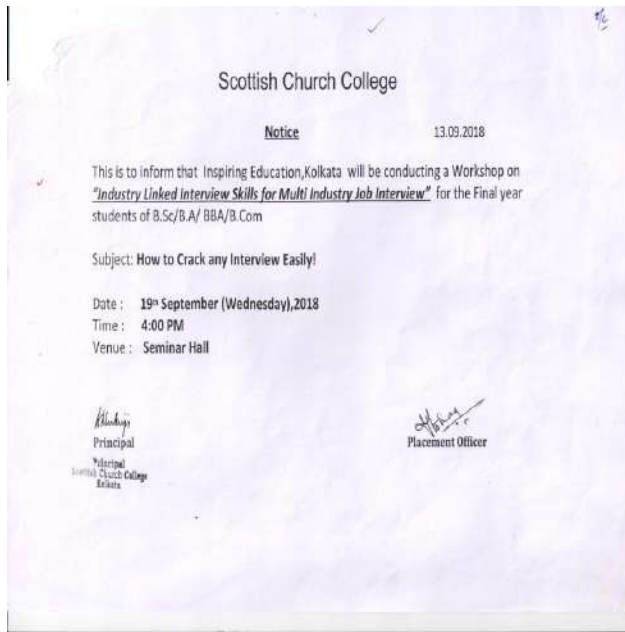
- A Workshop on “Basics of Interview Skills” was conducted by Endeavor Careers on 29th Nov, 2017. 69 students were in attendance.

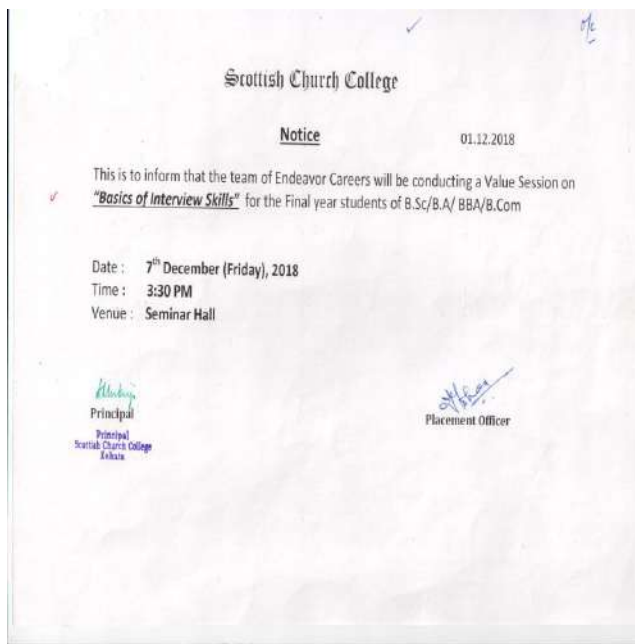

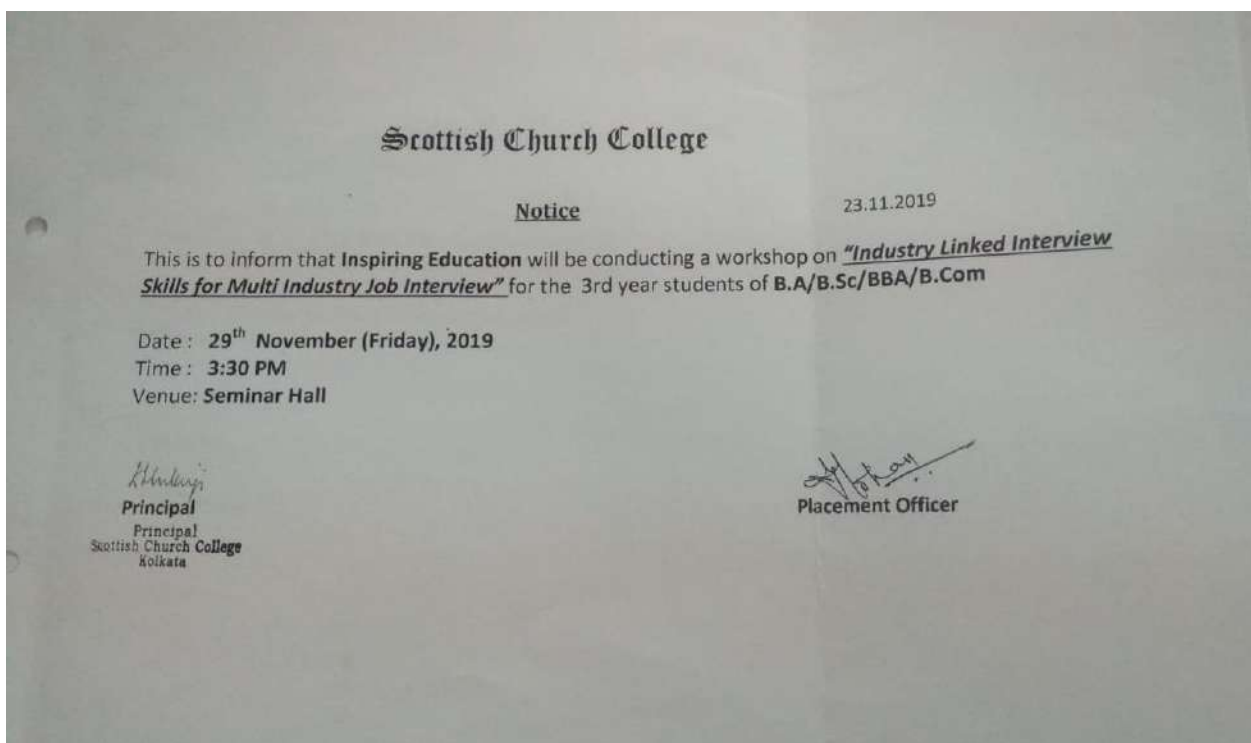

Apart from the students of the Economics Department, interested students from the Departments of Commerce and Business Administration of Scottish Church College, and students of Economics Departments of New Alipore College and Gurudas College participated in the webinar. 178 students participated in total over the two days.

Report on Life Skill programmes

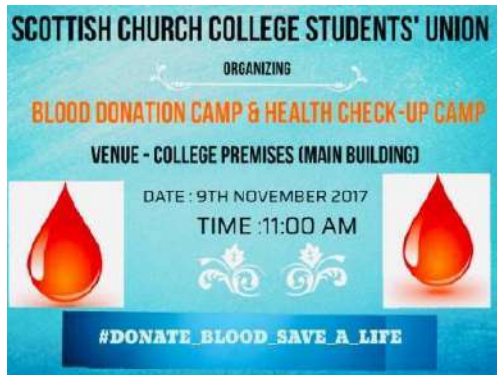

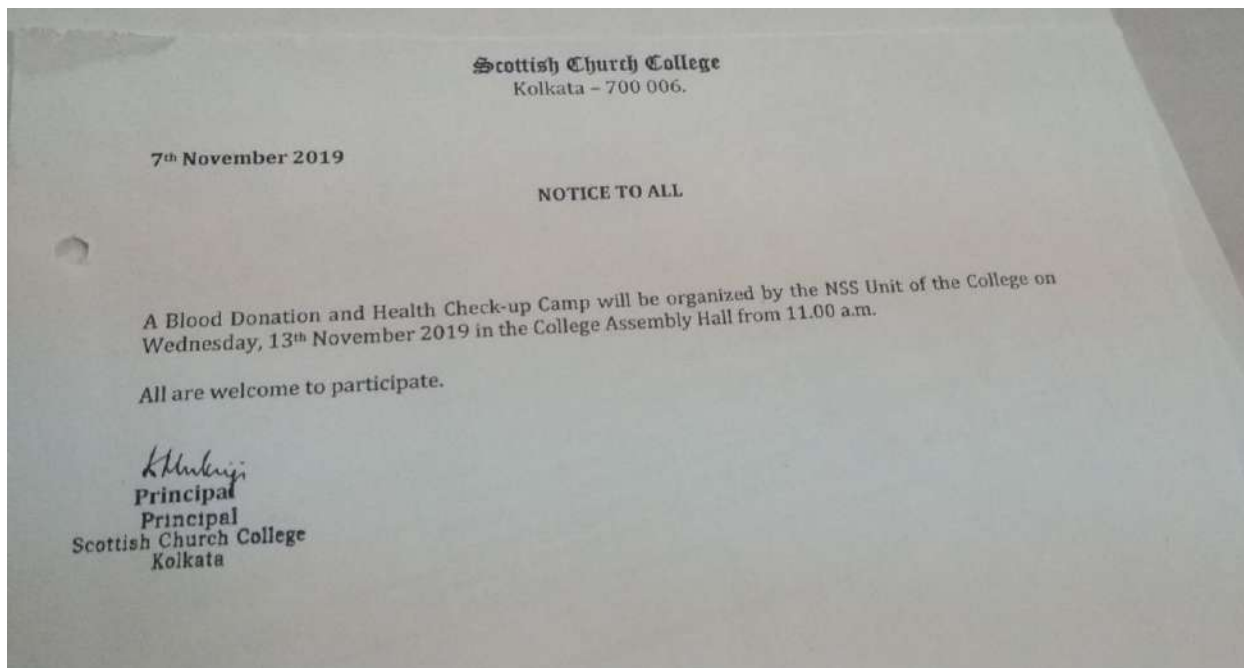

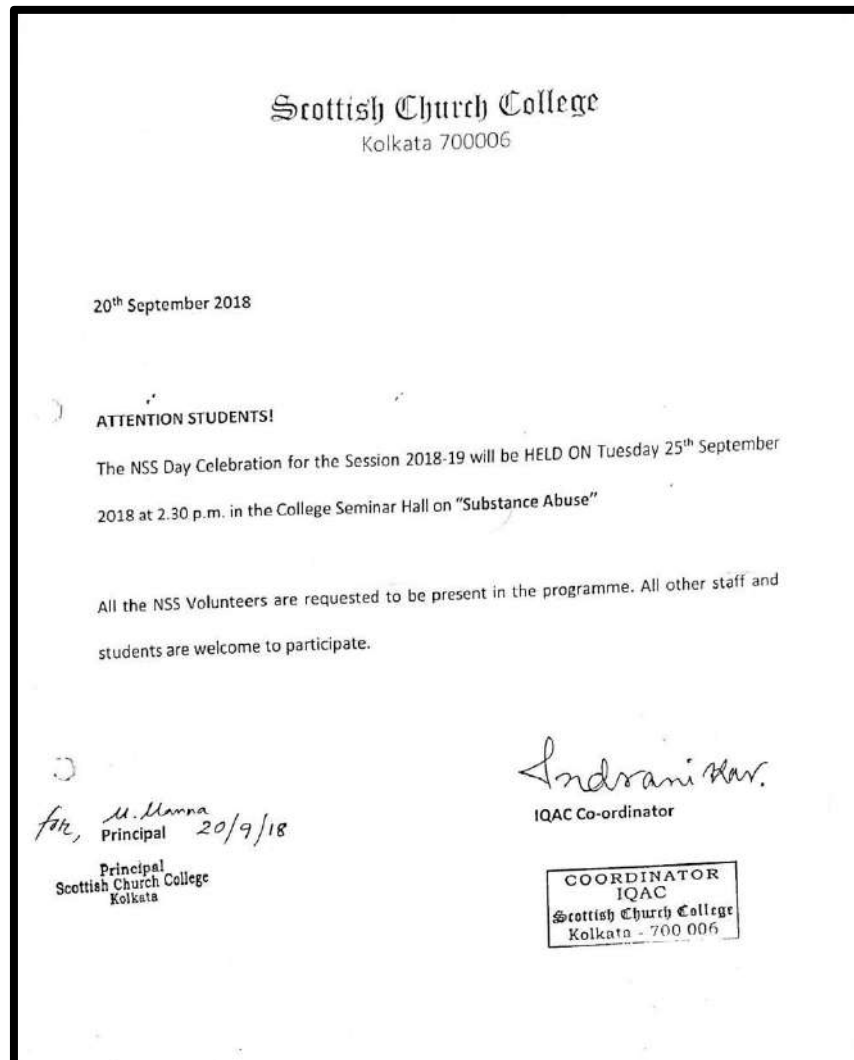

8. NSS Special Camp-- sessions were organized with Vivekananda Kendra Kanyakumarika on Surya Pranam. 50 NSS volunteers were present.

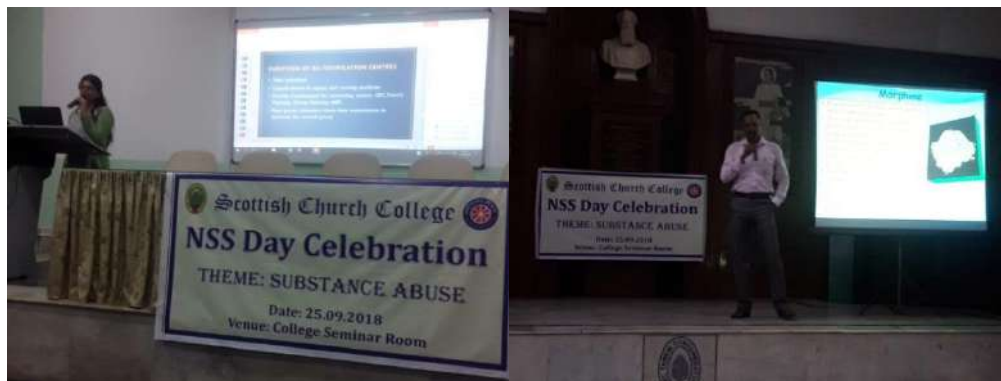

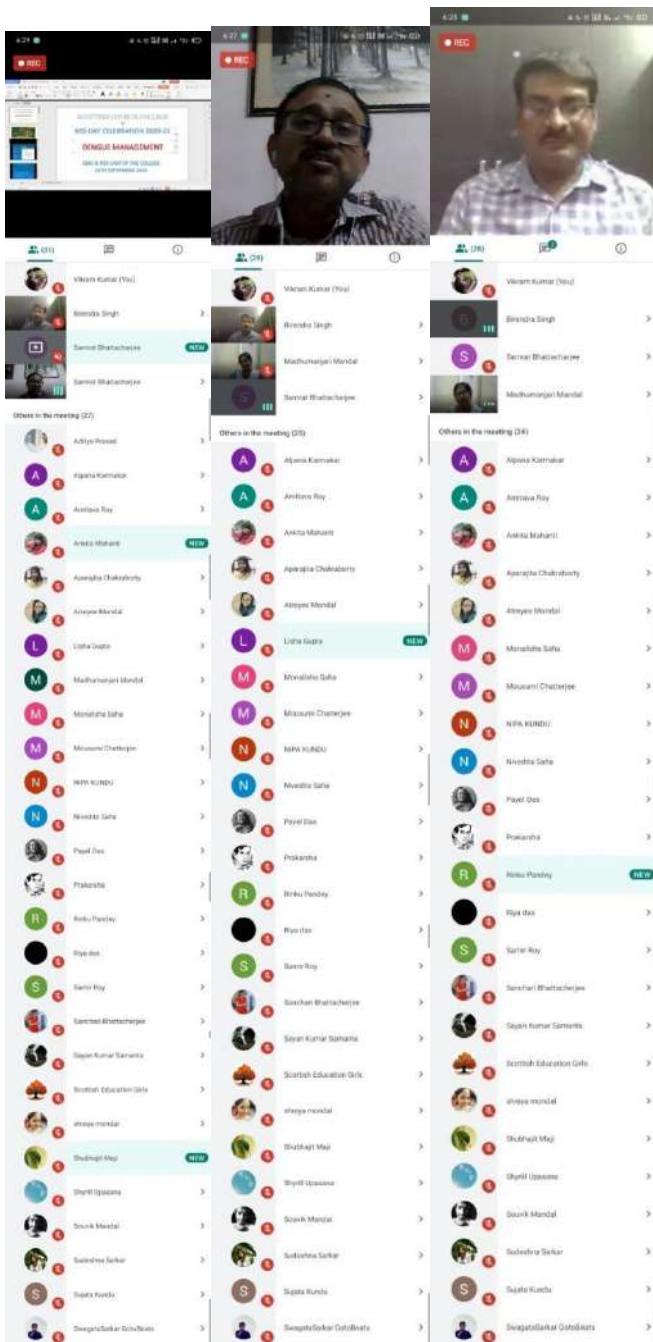

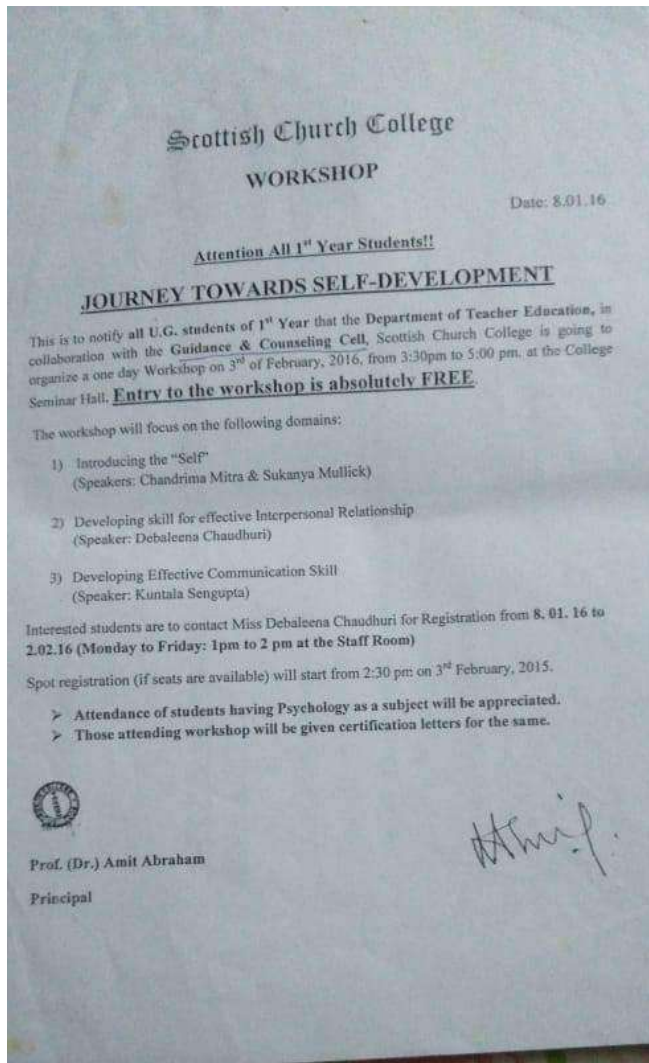
