On an average the number of students participating ranges from 80 to 200 approximately. 






3. **The Activity session was inaugurated on 27.08.2019** with the usual fanfare and unveiling of the Students' wall Magazine *Kheyal Pata*.





12. An inter college photography contest named Cale-light and Lens was held on 29th February 2020 where around 14 students from different colleges of Kolkata participated. All photographs were








6. Celebration of Netaji's Birthday (Online) 23rd January, 2021: -














7. Celebration of Republic Day (Online) 26th January, 2021:


















8. Celebration of Rabindra Jayanti (Online) 9th May, 2021:


