The departments of **History** and **Political Science** and the **Peace Studies Cell** of **Scottish Church College** in collaboration with the **Faculty of Political Science and International Studies, University of Warsaw, Poland** organised the **Ananta Kumar Sarker and Snehalata Sarker Memorial Students' Conference** on *Peace and World Politics: Changing Dynamics* on **22<sup>nd</sup> February, 2023**, 1 pm onwards (Indian Time) in a hybrid mode. This was the second academic collaboration under the MoU between the two organisations. This was also the second programme under the umbrella of the Ananta Kumar Sarker and Snehalata Sarker Endowment Fund dedicated to the cultivation of Peace studies in the college. This was the first programme for the SCC Peace Studies Cell.

The objective was to get the students across continents together on the same table to discuss the importance, practice and challenges of Peace in the context of world politics. Given the contemporary dynamics of geo-politics around the globe, dialogues and debates on relevant issues with peace in mind seem to be the need of the hour. Thus, the programme was oganised to give students a platform to voice their opinions and take a stand. The outcome was a wonderful session of 9 presentations on varied topics that ranged from the relativity of peace to war in Ukraine to the role of United Nations to disputes in Indo-Pacific region to Korean Peninsula Peace Initiative to peace in Buddhist scriptures.

The conference began with a welcome address by Dr. Madhumanjari Mandal, Principal, Scottish Church College followed by address by Mr. Tomasz Lukaszuk, former Ambassador of Poland to India and Dr. Supratim Das, Vice Principal, Scottish Church College, who introduced the conference to the audience. Dr. Riddhi Bhattacharya, Assistant Professor of History & Coordinator, Peace Studies Cell, Scottish Church College introduced the theme and set the tone of the conference. This was followed by the presentations by the students as listed below. 

How do you rate the content of today's conference?






How do you rate the technical organisation of today's conference? 51 responses




What is your opinion about the theme of the Conference being on Peace? 51 responses

The students on both sides were very well prepared especially when you follow the discussion from their point of view. A very well researched and well expressed seminar. Congratulations, students & faculty members.






