Mithun Chakraborty is an Indian actor, film producer and entrepreneur and politician who predominantly works in Hindi and Bengali films. In a career spanning over five decades, he has done 350 films, mostly in Bengali and Hindi languages. He earned his B.Sc. degree in Chemistry from Scottish Church College. After that, he attended and graduated from the Film and



Television Institute of India, Pune . He holds the record of being the only actor to win National Film Award for Best Actor for his debut film *Mrigayaa* in 1976. Over the years, Mithun displayed remarkable versatility — from art-house films to mass-market blockbusters, dance numbers to serious drama — showing his ability to adapt and thrive. In recognition of his monumental contribution to Indian cinema, he was awarded the prestigious *Padma Bhushan* in 2024. His journey — from a modest beginning to becoming a national icon — stands as a testament to talent, perseverance, and the enduring power of cinema.
